



Welcome to the fifth edition of Bears Matter. We have had such an exciting and busy few months since the last newsletter. We have been developing plans for new ventures for next year and of course, it goes without saying, we have been continuing to work hard supporting bear projects locally and around the world. So we are delighted to share with you all our latest news as 2012 draws to a close and we look forward to 2013.



We are delighted to begin this issue of Bears Matter with some really exciting news. We are now able to share with you that we are embarking on a wonderful project to help protect the Giant Panda and its habitat.

The Winton Bear Foundation will be working with Sarah M. Bexell, PhD the Director of Conservation Education at the Chengdu Research Base of Giant Panda Breeding. We will be funding the cost of around 2000 posters giving information on how best people can work to help save this beautiful bear and look after its natural surroundings.

The posters will be distributed to schools in the area and will help educate the next generation on how they can help ensure the survival of the Giant Panda. Through working with Sarah, we hope to be able to reach around 400 schools and as each school has around 600 or more students per school that means we can help play a part in educating around 240,000 children about the threats facing the Giant Panda.



This is one of our biggest projects to date but we also feel one of the most important. The cost of this project will be around £400 but we hope you will agree that considering we have the opportunity to reach almost a quarter of a million children who will form the next generation working to help save the panda, it is money well spent. As soon as we have an image of the final poster, we will share it with you.



At the end of the last edition of Bears Matter we told you that we had started to help Oliver, the incredible bear rescued by Animals Asia after spending over 30 years incarcerated on a bear farm. Oliver is a much loved bear in the 'bear world' and he has defied the odds after surviving, not only years of brutality but a dramatic rescue too and he is now thriving as a result of the love and care he is receiving in his new home. The Winton Bear Foundation have pledged to help fund specially adapted enrichment toys for Oliver, that he can enjoy, despite his disabilities.

The Bear Foundation is a staunch supporter of Animals Asia work and has recently joined their coalition of Animal Welfare organisations to stop the proposed eviction of 104 bears from their Vietnam sanctuary. See below for further details.

Some of you may recall that we have adopted two bears - 'Bodo' also rescued by Animals Asia from a Bear Farm in China and Max the blind bear, rescued by WSPA from life chained to railings as a tourist attraction in Romania. We have pledged to help fund the care of both these bears for the rest of their lives.

Frustratingly, earlier this year, there was a bank error in connection with the remittance of funds to the Liberty Bear Sanctuary in Romania for Max. We rectified the matter as soon as it was brought to our attention. We were so upset when we heard this, so to make sure Max didn't think we'd forgotten about him, we sent a little extra money so the staff could buy him some extra special treats from us!

We thought you might like to see these photos of Max tucking into his special treats of cakes, biscuits and wafers. Apparently he loved them and didn't stop until he'd finished off the whole lot!

We are also continuing to work closely with our friends at the Five Sisters Zoo in Scotland. The highly dedicated team at FSZ have worked incredibly hard to rescue and rehabilitate the three ex circus bears Carmen, Suzy and Peggy. At the end of our last newsletter we were in the process of helping fund the cost of some special vitamins to help play a part in restoring the bears to full health and also the purchase of some special enrichment toys. We are happy to announce that we have now done this and we wanted to share these pictures with you of one of the bears playing with their brand new 'Boomer Balls'. The balls are filled with peanuts and give the bears hours of pleasure trying to fish them out! During our last visit, we took a jar of honey for each of the bears as an extra special treat for them. We hope to be able to buy the bears lots more goodies next year!

It is also wonderful to be able to share with you, the latest news on the bears. Thanks to the commitment and dedication of the team at FSZ and the wonderful guidance and advice they received from renowned bear behaviourist and rehabilitator Else Poulsen, Carmen, Suzy and Peggy's natural instincts are beginning to kick in again and they are showing signs of denning and going into hibernation.

Reflecting on Oliver, Max, Carmen, Suzy and Peggy's stories, it just goes to show, that when given the right care, attention and respect, often for the first time in their lives, even the most traumatised of bears can go back to simply being a bear, if they are only given the chance.

We are very proud to be able to play a small part in the care of these special bears.

Animals Asia – Stop the Bear Eviction

The Winton Bear Foundation has recently joined a coalition of 140 animal welfare organisations from 24 different countries in signing a letter to the Vietnamese Prime Minister. Members of the coalition have joined forces to help prevent the proposed closure of the Animals Asia Vietnam Bear Rescue Centre and the subsequent eviction of 104 bears rescued from bear farms so that the ground can be used for commercial development.



The eviction is in direct violation of the government's 2005 agreement with Animals Asia to develop a facility that would house 200 endangered bears rescued from the illegal bear bile industry. The eviction of these bears would have a major negative impact on their mental and physical well-being. There is growing condemnation from around the world against this proposed eviction but Animals Asia still desperately need help to reverse this injustice. Fostering Compassion





BEARS MATTER MONTH February 14th - March 14th 2013





TOPPING UP 'THE HONEY POT'



Because the Bear Foundation is progressing so well, so quickly, we've decided to have a dedicated fundraising section in the newsletter. This will cover events that have happened, that are coming up and ways you can help. Funds raised are put into a pot of funds affectionately known as 'The Honey Pot.' These funds are then distributed at regular intervals to projects around the world, working to help bears and protect them from abuse and cruelty.



On September 1st & 2nd we attended one of our biggest events to date. WBF had a stand at the Love Pets show at the Royal Highland Centre, Edinburgh. The show had around 5000 visitors and our stand was in a great location and we had lots of visitors to our stall. We were able to showcase our first batch of branded merchandise and our helpers looked so smart in their brand new WBF T-shirts and the team and stand all looked so professional.

We raised £155.95, signed up 35 new supporters, two more Business Buddies (more details to follow) and Links Veterinary Surgery in Haddington, kindly offered to help work with us on our **Fostering Compassion** program. On November 29th we had a stall at the Scottish Legal Aid Board's Christmas Fair. We made around £30 raffling our teddy and handed out lots of information. The Scottish Legal Aid Board Charity Group has made the Winton Bear Foundation one of their nominated charities to receive money from their staff fundraising events. Thank you to Debbie Scott and Nick Macdonald and everyone at the SLAB for making us feel so welcome and for helping support our work.





Big bear hugs go to WBF supporter Karen Scott who has helped raise over £380 through a fundraising event at her work, the Royal Bank of Scotland. Each year they hold their 'Apprentice Challenge' which aims to raise as much money as possible in one month to support worthwhile causes. The staff undertake a number of activities such as bake sales, guess the teddy's weight, dress down days, book sales and karaoke and waxing nights to name a few. There were four charities nominated and Karen nominated the Winton Bear Foundation and the total raised to be split four ways was £1527, so WBF is in line to receive £380 – a massive amount! A huge thank you goes to Karen and her colleagues at the Royal Bank of Scotland.


